



You will need

- A4 paper (and preferably a printer)
- Scissors
- Glue
- Paint and paint brushes

Step 1 - Create your headdress base

The first step for all the designs is to create the headdress base. You can do this with two pieces of A4. The templates for the base are on pages 8 and 9 of this booklet., You will end up with 4 pieces in total for your base.







To put your base together you first take part 1, and stick one side of part 2 to it. Then measure around your head to stick the other end of part 2 to the other side of part 1. This forms a crown shape, where the top of heart shape will sit above your eyebrows.

You then take part 3 and part 4 and glue them to the inside of your crown shape, so that one of them crosses over the other to form a top to your base like in the picture below.







Print out your Eid pattern templates

If you haven't already, print out your templates (pages 14 onwards).

No printer? No problem! You can copy some of the designs or even make up your own EID carnival costume.



Paint and cut out your patterns

You can colour the patterns any way you wish. In our example we have used blue and gold.



Decorate your headdress

Now you can add all your decorative pieces to your base to make your headdress look really amazing. In our example we have put the big circular moon and lamp design in the middle, with a pattern at the back, and lamp designs either side.










For the collar base:


Print out the templates on pages 10-13 of this booklet. You will print out four pieces, or alternatively draw them on paper, cut them out and then clue each piece together. As you can see in the picture below, there are 4 shape - A, B, C and D. If you fix them together, by folding and using the tabs in the template, then you will end up with the correct shape!






Cut out and decorate your collar designs

You can find the collar designs on pages 14 onwards. There is a large circle pattern, which comes in four pieces, and some smaller circular patterns.








Simply cut these out and paint or colour them. When you are ready, glue them to your collar with the large circle and the front, and the smaller circle patters in the remaining spaces.
